Community Youth Service Award Scholarship Program

The award is based on the impact the student has had through volunteering, raising funds, helping other students or individuals within the Aurora community. One student from each of the following schools is selected each year: Aurora High School, Cardinal Carter High School, Dr. G.W. Williams Secondary School, Ecole Secondaire Catholique Renaissance and St. Maximilian Kolbe Catholic High School.

School Healthy Snack Program
